Grade 9 Admissions
Frequently Asked Questions

1. When should I apply to GLTS?
It is recommended that you apply as soon as your first Quarter/Trimester report card is available, which is usually around October/November.

2. What is the deadline for submitting an application to GLTS?
February 1, 2020, is the suggested deadline. However, we have a “Rolling Admissions Policy” which means we will continue to accept applications if space is available. You have a much better chance of being accepted if you apply before February 1st!

3. What does a COMPLETE application for admission include?
 - A completed “Application for Admission” with no blank spaces on pages 1 and 2.
 - Page 2 must be completed by the middle school Guidance Counselor and includes the student’s SASID number, counselor evaluation, and counselor signature.
 - The middle school counselor must also attach numeric grades, discipline and attendance reports for **both Grades 7 and 8.**

***Incomplete applications will not be reviewed until all required information is received.**

4. What if there are extenuating circumstances that may affect the chances of a student’s acceptance to GLTS based on the set criteria?
In the event of truly extenuating circumstances, the middle school counselor or principal can attach a letter to the application to explain.

5. When will I know if I have been accepted to GLTS?
You will receive a letter in the mail as soon as possible, usually in March.

6. What can I do if I am not accepted?
If you are denied admission to GLTS you may request a review of the decision by contacting the Director of Admissions in writing within fifteen (15) days of receipt of your letter. Please see our school’s complete Admissions Policy on the GLTS website.

Final grades, attendance and discipline records must be forwarded to GLTS at the end of the school year. A student’s acceptance may be revoked if they do not pass all core academic classes and maintain satisfactory discipline and attendance.
